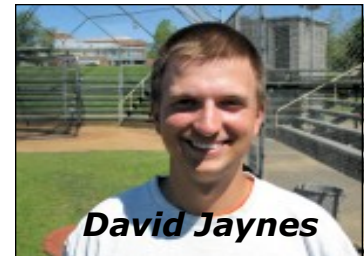

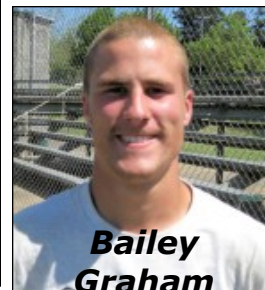

2009 PIL SEASON IN REVIEW

End of Season: Wilson concluded it's 2009 season as the PIL Baseball Champion for the fourth year in a row. The team went forward to State playoffs and the forward push for success was stopped by a thunderstorm! Wilson lost 15-3 at Roseburg in the Semi-Finals of the State Playoffs. The game was replayed because of a thunderstorm the previous day. It is the same score as the first game loss to Brophy Prep in Phoenix.

School records set by the 2009 team:

- highest team batting average, League, .417; Season .363
- runs scored team, League, 241
- lowest team earned run average, League, 0.63
- highest batting average, League, Bailey Graham, .600 (tie, 2008)
- most hits, League, Bailey Graham, 33
- most strikeouts, League, Stuart Fewel, 71; Season, Stuart Fewel, 112
- most shutouts, League, Stuart Fewel, 4; Season, Stuart Fewel, 5
- fewest base on balls, League, Stuart Fewel, 3; Season, Stuart Fewel, 8

Ten players were selected to first-team all-League: pitchers Stuart Fewel and Alex Massar, catcher Bailey Graham, second baseman Jordan West, third basemen Jeff Reid and Darren Nigo, shortstop Brent Graham, and outfielders David Jaynes, Taylor Newell, and Peter Valentine. Brent and Bailey Graham, Fewel, and Massar were selected to play in the State-Metro All-Star Series held at McMinnville.

These selections are the most in one year in the last 27 years. A year of many accomplishments!!!
